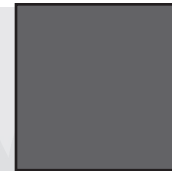

Linda Biehl is the mother of Amy Biehl. Amy was an American Fulbright Scholar working in South Africa against apartheid who was beaten and stabbed to death in a township near Cape Town.

Ntobeko Peni, one of the convicted men in the murder of Amy Biehl, now works for the Amy Biehl Foundation Trust in Cape Town, a non-profit organization which dedicates its work to putting up barriers against violence.
