Michael McCann** (seated at right) joined the Law School as Adjunct Professor of Law and Boden Teaching Fellow, after an extraordinary run of 38 years as District Attorney of Milwaukee County. McCann, who received an honorary doctorate of laws from Marquette University in 1997, looks forward to engagement in the mission of the Law School.

"I have long had a great deal of respect for Marquette lawyers, as could probably be seen in my almost four decades of hiring practices as district attorney."

For the past 25 years, Gousha has been a prominent broadcast journalist in Milwaukee—in fact, he was termed by the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* last year as "maybe the best there ever was in Milwaukee television." "This is just the beginning," said Gousha. "I came to Marquette University Law School because Father Wild and Dean Kearney persuaded me that their standards and ambitions for the Law School are extremely high. It is an exciting place these days."
