The methodology

- The survey was conducted Jan. 24-31, 2024, interviewing 930
 Wisconsin registered voters, with a margin of error of +/-4.2
 percentage points.
- The sample includes 408 Republicans and independents who lean Republican, with a margin of error of +/-6.4 percentage points.





Partisan makeup

- The partisan makeup of the sample is 32% Republican, 30% Democratic and 37% independent.
- Since January 2020, the long-term partisan balance has been 30% Republican and 28% Democratic, with 41% independent.





The methodology, what's new!

- We've changed how we conduct the poll
- The survey was conducted with a hybrid sample of 727
 respondents selected from the Wisconsin voter registration
 list, and 203 selected from the SSRS Opinion Panel, a sample
 drawn from postal addresses across the state and invited to
 take part in surveys online.
- The interviews were conducted online with 814 respondents and with 116 by telephone with live interviewers.






The Presidential race nine months out

















Biden vs Trump by party identification













Five way ballot by party identification







Biden nominee by party identification











Trump nominee by party identification







Who is likely to win by party identification













Republican candidate favorability










Trump vs Haley by Trump favorability










Enthusiasm and likelihood of voting





Enthusiasm by survey










Biden vs Trump by enthusiasm










Biden vs Trump by likelihood of voting




Candidate Favorability among all registered voters






All candidate favorability












Biden vs Trump by Biden job approval










Perceptions of Biden and Trump















Direction of the country, economic conditions and personal financial situation






Right direction or wrong track







Right direction or wrong track by party identification










View of national economy










View of national economy by party identification










Wisconsin vs national economy










View of Wisconsin economy by party identification












Family finances by party identification










Approval of governor, legislature and state Supreme Court




Favorability of state elected officials and potential U.S. Senate candidates





State political figures favorability








Favor or oppose redistricting decision by party identification








Legalize medical marijuana by party identification










Ban abortion after 14 weeks by party identification










Confidence in the 2020 election by party identification










