
# The methodology

- The survey was conducted Oct. 16-24, 2024, interviewing 834 Wisconsin registered voters, with a margin of error of +/-4.4 percentage points.
- There are 753 likely voters with a margin of error of +/-4.4 percentage points.
- New likely voter model is based on voter list record of voting since 2016, assigning each respondent a probability of voting.

# Partisan makeup

- The partisan makeup of the sample is 36% Republican, 31% Democratic and 34% independent.
- Since January 2020, the long-term partisan balance has been 31% Republican and 29% Democratic, with 40% independent.
- With independents who lean to a party counted as partisans the sample is 47% Republican, 42% Democratic and 11% independent. The long term average is 45% Republican and 44% Democratic, with 10% independent.


### Party identification trend, Wisconsin





Among likely voters





### Two-candidate vote trend, Wisconsin








### Senate vote trend with undecided, Wisconsin


Among Wisconsin likely voters








### Who is likely to win presidential election



# Biden job approval trend




### Trump retrospective job approval trend



Among registered voters, pooled July-October





Gender gap within demographic groups


### Vote margin Harris minus Trump among demographic groups by gender

Among registered voters, pooled July-October, sorted from smallest to largest gender gap
















## Which candidate would do a better job on issues, Wisconsin

Among Wisconsin registered voters




#### Most important issue, Wisconsin


#### Most important issue by party ID, Wisconsin


### Who is better on the voter's most important issue



### Baldwin favorability trend




#### Hovde favorability trend




#### Right direction or wrong track trend



#### Evers approval trend


