
The methodology

- The survey was conducted June 13-19, 2025, interviewing 873
 Wisconsin registered voters, with a margin of error of +/-4.7
 percentage points.
- A number of policy questions are asked of a random halfsample of 436 or 437 registered voters with a margin of error of +/- 6.6 percentage points. Using a half sample allows us to double the number of policy topics covered in the poll.

Partisan makeup


- The partisan makeup of the sample is 36% Republican, 32% Democratic and 32% independent.
- When independents who lean to a party are counted as partisans the sample is 46% Republican, 42% Democratic and 12% independent.
- In all polls conducted in 2024, the combined samples were 33% Republican, 31% Democratic and 36% independent.
- Counting independents who lean to a party as partisans, the 2024 samples were 45% Republican, 42% Democratic and 12% independent.



















Make Supreme Court elections partisan by party identification Among registered voters








Will Trump policies reduce inflation by party identification Among registered voters 55 31 61






Will budget reduce federal deficit by party identification Among registered voters 30 67 43 56




















Satisfaction with public schools by party identification Among registered voters




Satisfaction with schools trend



Property tax or school funding trend






Figure 3: Referendum Approval Tracks Favoring More K-12 Spending

% that favor increasing spending on public schools to reducing property taxes in Marquette Law Poll and passage rate of referenda in same year question was asked






Ban cell phones throughout school day by party identification Among registered voters


