
The methodology

- The survey was conducted Oct. 15-22, 2025, interviewing 846
 Wisconsin registered voters, with a margin of error of +/-4.5
 percentage points.
- A number of policy questions are asked of a random half-samples of 423 registered voters with a margin of error of +/- 6.4 percentage points.
- The sample size for Republican primary voters is 406, with a margin of error of 6.4 percentage points. The sample size for Democratic primary voters is 378, with a margin of error of 6.9 percentage points.

Partisan makeup


- The partisan makeup of the sample is 36% Republican, 32% Democratic and 33% independent.
- When independents who lean to a party are counted as partisans the sample is 46% Republican, 42% Democratic and 13% independent.
- In all polls conducted in 2024, the combined samples were 33% Republican, 31% Democratic and 36% independent.
- Counting independents who lean to a party as partisans, the 2024 samples were 45% Republican, 42% Democratic and 12% independent.



Among Wisconsin registered voters




Undecided in primary by heard about campaign




Favorability Republican candidates






Favorability Democratic candidates




Republican name ID by media market






Democratic name ID by media market




Republican primary choice

Among Republican primary voters




Democratic primary choice




Favorability Supreme Court candidates




Likely to vote in April by party identification









Partisan court elections by party identification




Issue concerns Among registered voters







Grocery prices by party identification




Effect of Trump policy on inflation by party identification







Tariffs help or hurt economy by party identification




Tariffs help or hurt Wisconsin farmers by party identification








Favorability to ACA by party identification







Property tax or school funding trend






Evers job approval trend
